ORDINANCE NO. 2019-006

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 14-101 OF THE CITY OF EAGLEVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES

(Amends Ordinance 2016-009)

Municipal Planning Commission

Creation and Membership

Whereas, Section 14-101 of the Eagleville Code of Ordinances sets the Creation and Membership of the Eagleville Planning Commission; and,

Whereas, the Eagleville City Council desires to amend this section;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Eagleville Tennessee City Council that Section 14-101 of the Code of Ordinances, also known as the Municipal Code, is hereby amended to read:

14-101. Creation and membership. Pursuant to the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated Section 13-4-101, there is hereby created a municipal planning commission, hereinafter referred to as the planning commission. The planning commission shall consist of five (5) members; two (2) of these shall be the mayor and member of the city council selected by the council one being the mayor or his/her designee, another being and a member of the city council, who shall be selected by the council. The other three members shall be appointed by the mayor. All members of the planning commission shall serve as such without compensation. Except for the initial appointments, the terms of the three (3) members appointed by the city council mayor shall be for three (3) years with one (1) member's term expiring each year. Upon more than one vacancy, the mayor may at his/her discretion appoint one (1) or more of the new appointments in such a way to allow each term to expire a year apart. The terms of the mayor or his/her designee and members selected by the city council shall run concurrently with their terms of office. Any vacancy in an appointive membership shall be filled for the unexpired term by the mayor, who shall also have the authority to remove any appointive member at his will and pleasure

BE IT ENACTED that this ordinance shall take effect after its final passage, the public welfare requiring it.
